

Ha Long Bay

Ha Long Bay is a world-famous natural wonder. It is scattered with 1,969 large islands and small islets, most of which were formed from limestone mountains over a period of more than 500 million years. The mountains also have caves that contain thousands of unique stalactites and rock formations.

In Ha Long Bay, the islets are mostly covered with small shrubs, while the large islands have tropical vegetation and are home to many rare bird species. Cat Ba Island, in particular, is primarily tropical rainforest, with submerged forests and coral reefs. The island is also home to a number of rare primate species, such as the Cat Ba langur – also known as the yellow-headed langur – of which there are only 60 left on Earth. Ha Long Bay is also home to more than 1,000 species of marine animals and more than 160 types of coral.
