Joseph Merrick was born in England in 1862. He started developing abnormally early in childhood, and, by the time he was an adult, his body had become grossly misshapen. His head and right arm were deformed, his skin was covered in scales, he walked with a limp, and he was unable to speak clearly. However, there was nothing wrong with his mind.
